

**PROPOSAL FOR NEW STUDENT AWARD**

**The Elene & David Wood Engineering Scholarships**

<b>PROPOSING FACULTY</b>	Faculty of Engineering
<b>TITLE OF THE OF AWARD</b>	The Elene & David Wood Engineering Scholarships
<b>NATURE AND VALUE OF THE AWARD</b>	Between 1 and 3 scholarships will be awarded each year depending on the quality of the applications. Value of scholarship will vary depending on the number of scholarships awarded. A total of \$12,000 is available per annum. Each award will be for one year.
<b>SPONSOR/DONOR</b>	Emeritus Professor David Wood and Mrs Elene Wood & the Melbourne University Engineering Foundation (MUEF)
<b>PERIOD FOR WHICH AWARD IS COMMITTED</b>	Five years commencing in 2005
<b>ELIGIBILITY</b>	All students completing their final year of secondary school wishing to undertake the first year of an undergraduate degree in the Department of Chemical & Biomolecular Engineering in the Faculty of Engineering.
<b>SELECTION CRITERIA</b>	<p>Applications will be shortlisted to 6 by a member of staff from the Faculty Office and a member of staff from the Department of Chemical &amp; Biomolecular Engineering. The final selection committee will consist of the above nominees as well as the Chair of the Melbourne University Engineering Foundation and Emeritus Professor David Wood or his nominee.</p> <p>The selection criteria, in order of priority, for the scholarship are:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"><li>• Financial need - as determined by information on the application form.</li><li>• Disadvantage – as defined by the University’s Access Melbourne Scheme or its successor.</li><li>• Academic ability</li></ul> <p>Greatest emphasis should be given to financial need when assessing applicants. When judging academic ability, Year 12 or equivalent results will be considered.</p>
<b>SPECIAL CONDITIONS</b>	The awarding of the scholarship is dependent on the student successfully receiving an offer of a place in an undergraduate course in the Department of Chemical & Biomolecular Engineering at the University of Melbourne. The Selection Committee reserves the right to not award the scholarships if no suitable candidate is identified.
