

**R6.59 - WALTER KIRBY SINGING SCHOLARSHIP****Recitals-**

- A. Walter Joseph Regis Kirby formerly of Melbourne professional singer bequeathed to the University in 1938 the sum of £1,000 on the condition that the "income therefrom shall be applied by the authorities of such University for the time being to establish a singing scholarship to be known as the Walter Kirby Singing Scholarship" and provided that "the scholarship shall be awarded every year and shall be subject to such conditions as the authorities shall from time to time determine".
- B. The University received the sum of £1,031 6s. 10d. in satisfaction of the bequest, which sum increased to \$2,168 at 31 December 1994.

It is provided as follows -

1. The sum of \$2,168 and any accumulations or additions to the sum forms a fund called the "Walter Kirby Singing Scholarship" ("the fund") and the fund must be paid into an investment pool and remain there until the Council directs otherwise.
2. The amount of the scholarship is the net annual income of the fund.
3. The scholarship is awarded by the Council on the recommendation of Faculty of Music ("the faculty") to a student who is pursuing the course for the degree of bachelor of Music or bachelor of Music Education and is specialising in vocal performance.
4. The scholarship is open for award annually for one year but may be renewed for a further period of one year on the recommendation of the faculty.
5. During the period of tenure the scholar must diligently pursue studies in a course of subjects prescribed by the dean of the faculty.
