

## **R6.65 - LADY HUNTINGFIELD MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP**

### **Recitals-**

- A. The sum of £1,000 was subscribed for the foundation of a scholarship in memory of Lady Huntingfield wife of the Fifth Baron Huntingfield Governor of Victoria from 1934 to 1939, and the sum was presented by the Executive Committee of subscribers to the University to be administered in the following manner.
- B. The sum of £1,000 increased to \$3,721 at 31 December 1994.

It is provided as follows-

- 1. The sum of \$3,721 and any accumulations or additions to the sum forms a fund called the "Lady Huntingfield Memorial Scholarship" ("the fund") and the fund must be paid into an investment pool and remain there until the Council directs otherwise.
- 2. The scholarship is open for competition among women students who are qualified to enter and are for the first time entering the course for the degree of bachelor of Social Work ("the degree").
- 3. The scholarship is awarded by the Council on the recommendation of the faculty of Arts.
- 4. The emoluments of the scholarship are the net income of the fund during the preceding year.
- 5. In the award of the scholarship preference must be given to a candidate who satisfies the faculty of Arts that she could not without financial assistance undertake a University course.
- 6. Before being awarded the scholarship the candidate selected from those recommended by the faculty of Arts must declare that she intends to engage in social work for at least two years after completing the course for the degree.
- 7. The scholarship is awarded for up to four years but the scholar's tenure is dependent upon her undertaking the course for the degree and at an annual review satisfying the faculty of Arts as to her progress in the course and her continued financial need.
