

## Spanish

Spanish (Castilian) is one of the world's major languages, spoken by over 400 million people and the official language of 22 countries, as well as being one of the official languages of the European Union. Portuguese, also an official European Union language, is the second most widely spoken of the romance languages after Spanish, having approximately 200 million speakers across four continents and Oceania. Catalan, the language of Catalonia and its capital Barcelona, has its own rich culture and history.

The Spanish Program at La Trobe University provides a comprehensive range of subjects within the general area of Hispanic and Iberian language. By cross-institutional course arrangements, students of the University of Melbourne may study Spanish, Portuguese language in both its forms (those of Portugal and Brazil), Catalan, and Peninsular and Latin American literature, culture and linguistics. Students may complete a major in Spanish or Ibero-American studies.

### Faculty of Arts requirements

**Special enrolment arrangements apply. Students must contact the Faculty of Arts office for application forms and details.**

Spanish beginners 1 and 2, and intermediate 1 will be taught at the University of Melbourne Parkville campus. Subject to sufficient enrolments, and subject to teacher availability, other classes may also be held at the University of Melbourne Parkville campus.

Studies in Spanish, Portuguese or Catalan cannot be undertaken in conjunction with any other complementary course language subjects.

A major in Spanish (or Ibero-American studies for students undertaking Catalan or Portuguese in later years) is usually only possible for students who commence Spanish study during the first year of their BA. Students commencing Spanish during later years may not be able to complete a major in Spanish or Ibero-American studies due to the structural constraints of the BA degree.

### Language study streams

#### Spanish

The Spanish program at La Trobe University offers three streams of Spanish:

##### beginners

The beginners stream is available to students with little or no prior knowledge of Spanish.

##### intermediate

The intermediate stream is usually only available to students who have undertaken four or five years of secondary school Spanish or an approved equivalent, but not to those who have sat for VCE Spanish or an equivalent.

##### advanced

The advanced stream is usually only available to students who have obtained at least a pass in VCE Spanish or an approved equivalent.

#### Portuguese

The Spanish program at La Trobe University offers two levels of Portuguese:

##### beginners

The beginners level of Portuguese is available to students with little or no prior knowledge of Portuguese but who have successfully completed at least one year of study in another romance language.

##### advanced

The advanced level of Portuguese is only available to students who have completed the beginners year or an approved equivalent, such as VCE Portuguese.

#### Catalan

The Spanish program at La Trobe University at present offers one level of Catalan:

##### beginners

The beginners level of Catalan is available to students with little or no prior knowledge of Catalan but who have successfully completed at least one year of study in another romance language.

The Spanish program determines the language stream or level in which a student is to enrol. Placement is based on VCE results, other language study records or a placement test.

Enrolment remains provisional until confirmed, or, alternatively, altered according to the student's needs as determined by the program during the first two weeks of teaching. As far as possible, the program will notify students of any changes to their stream enrolment during the first two weeks of semester.

Where a change is made in the third or fourth week of semester it will be reported to the Associate Dean (Academic Programs) at the University of Melbourne. **Where changes are made, students must ensure that their enrolment is changed at both universities.**

### Requirements for a major in Spanish

A major in Spanish consists of 125 points comprising:

- four first year subjects in Spanish (37.5 points) and;
- two second year subjects in Spanish (37.5 points) and;
- third year Spanish subjects (50 points).

### Major in Ibero-American studies

Any student considering this major must have the approval of the coordinator of the Spanish program at La Trobe University.

A major in Ibero-American studies consists of 125 points comprising:

- four first year subjects in Spanish (37.5 points) and;
- two second year subjects in Spanish and/or Portuguese (37.5 points) and;
- third year subjects of Spanish and/or Portuguese or Catalan (50 points).

## Honours entry

### Combined honours at Melbourne University

Honours in Spanish must be combined with honours in another area of study within the Faculty of Arts at the University of Melbourne.

The prerequisites for entry to fourth year honours in Spanish are:

- completion of all the requirements for the BA and;
- completion of a major in Spanish or Ibero-American studies and;
- completion of a major in the combined area of study and;
- an average grade of H2B or higher over the second/third year subjects of the Spanish or Ibero-American studies major.

Entry to honours must be approved by the coordinator of the Spanish Program at La Trobe and the Faculty of Arts honours course adviser.

### Pure honours

Students who have completed the above major in the advanced or intermediate streams at Melbourne will be eligible to be considered for pure honours at La Trobe University; however students who have completed the above major for beginners stream may be required to complete extra subjects before being considered for the pure honours offered at La Trobe.

Students interested in undertaking pure honours in Spanish or Ibero-American studies should consult with the Spanish honours coordinator at La Trobe University.

## Honours requirements

### Combined honours

Students undertaking combined honours in Spanish and another area of study must complete:

- 922-217 LaTrobe-Spanish Thesis (*p.7*) or 922-130 LaTrobe-Spanish Thesis (MYE) (*p.7*) (37.5 points) and;
- two honours subjects in Spanish (25 points) and;
- three honours subjects in the combined area of study (37.5 points).

*or*

- honours thesis in the combined area of study (37.5 points) and;
- two honours subjects in the combined area of study (25 points) and;
- two honours subjects in Spanish (37.5 points).

## Studying overseas

Students are encouraged to take in-country studies in Spanish, Catalan or Portuguese speaking countries or areas.

The subject 922-015 LaTrobe-Study Abroad Spain (*p.6*) is designed to facilitate such study in Spain with pre-organised courses and credit for approved students. Credit may also be granted for other approved subjects. Scholarships are also available to assist with expenses.

## Career opportunities

Studying Spanish, Catalan or Portuguese can be a great advantage to a wide range of professions. These include tourism and hospitality, teaching and the education sector, translating and interpreting, multicultural radio, television and journalism, the health and welfare sectors, the public service sector, non-government and aid organisations.

## Further study

The BA and BA (Honours) with a major in Spanish or Ibero-American studies can lead to the completion of higher degrees such as masters and doctorates in Spanish or Ibero-American studies at La Trobe University and at universities around the world.

### 922-001 LaTrobe-Spanish Beginners 1A

**Note:** Special enrolment arrangements apply. Students must contact the Faculty of Arts office for application forms and further details. This subject was previously 1B1: Beginners Spanish 1.

**Availability:** 1st year

**Credit points:** 12.5

**HECS-band:** 1

**Coordinator:** Ms Ana Maria Ducasse

**Corequisites:** Spanish Beginners 1B

**Contact:** Three hours of practical language classes per week (*Semester 1*).

**Description:** This subject is a practical introduction to the Spanish language. The student learns the language largely in genuine or simulated real-life situations (a communicative approach to language learning), rather than through instruction in grammar and translation. Throughout the semester, cultural aspects of the Hispanic world are introduced through the language classes.

**Assessment:** Written work totalling 1000 words, oral/aural work totalling 1500 words, a 1-hour written test, and a 15-minute listening test.

**Prescribed texts:** T D Terrell, M Andrade, J Egasse & E M Muñoz, *Dos Mundos. A Communicative Approach*, 5th ed, McGraw-Hill, 2001: also available with CD-ROM.

### 922-207 LaTrobe-Spanish Beginners 1B

**Note:** Special enrolment arrangements apply. Students must contact the Faculty of Arts office for application forms and further details. This subject was previously 1B2: Beginners Spanish 1.

**Availability:** 1st year

**Credit points:** 6.25

**HECS-band:** 1

**Coordinator:** Ms Ana Maria Ducasse

**Corequisites:** 922-001 LaTrobe-Spanish Beginners 1A (*p.2*).

**Contact:** A 1-hour practical class and a 1-hour laboratory class per week (*Semester 1*).

**Description:** This subject concentrates on training in listening and speaking skills in Spanish. Listening activities constitute the core of the subject, presenting new structures and vocabulary in context and providing students with models for pronunciation and discourse. Students will work individually and in small groups on a range of activities and tasks involving comprehension, pronunciation and dialogue production. Much of this work will be done via the computer-aided language laboratory and the audio language laboratory.

**Assessment:** Two 15-minute listening comprehension tests, and a 10-minute oral production test, and class participation.

**Prescribed texts:** T D Terrell, M Andrade, J Egasse & E M Muñoz, *Dos Mundos. A Communicative Approach*, 5th ed, McGraw-Hill, 2001: also available with CD-ROM.

**Prerequisites:** 922-001 LaTrobe-Spanish Beginners 1A (*p.2*) and 922-207 LaTrobe-Spanish Beginners 1B (*p.2*) or approval of the subject coordinator.

**Corequisites:** 922-208 LaTrobe-Spanish Beginners 1D (*p.3*).

**Contact:** Three hours of practical language classes per week (*Semester 2*).

**Description:** This subject continues to emphasise the acquisition of Spanish through a communicative approach to language learning but on a more advanced level than Spanish 1A. Throughout the semester, cultural aspects of the Hispanic world continue to be incorporated into the language classes.

**Assessment:** Written work totalling 1000 words, oral/aural work totalling 1500 words, a 1-hour written test, and a 15-minute listening test.

**Credit points:** 6.25 **HECS-band:** 1

**Prerequisites:** 922-001 LaTrobe-Spanish Beginners 1A (p.2) and 922-207 LaTrobe-Spanish Beginners 1B (p.2) or approval of the subject coordinator.

**Corequisites:** 922-002 LaTrobe-Spanish Beginners 1C (p.2).

**Contact:** A 1-hour practical class and a 1-hour laboratory class per week (*Semester 2*).

**Description:** This subject concentrates on training in listening and speaking skills in Spanish. Listening activities constitute the core of the subject, presenting new structures and vocabulary in context and providing students with models for pronunciation and discourse. Students will work individually and in small groups on a range of activities and tasks involving comprehension, pronunciation and dialogue production. **Credit points:** 12.5 **HECS-band:** 1

**Coordinator:** Ms Isabel Moutinho

**Prerequisites:** Some knowledge of Spanish without completion of VCE Spanish or an approved equivalent, and approval of the subject coordinator.

**Corequisites:** 922-211 LaTrobe-Spanish Intermediate 1B (p.3).

**Contact:** Three hours of practical language classes per week (*Semester 1*).

**Description:** This subject emphasises the skills of speaking and listening, while also attending to the development of reading and writing skills. The student will be involved in a wide range of language acquisition activities and will be exposed to the Spanish language and Hispanic culture through the written language, radio, TV and film. The subject is available only to students who have some prior knowledge of Spanish, but who do not have VCE Spanish or equivalent.

**Assessment:** Written work of 1250 words, oral/aural tests totalling 30 minutes and a 1.5-hour written test.

### 922-211 LaTrobe-Spanish Intermediate 1B

**Credit points:** 6.25 **HECS-band:** 1

**Coordinator:** Ms Isabel Moutinho

**Prerequisites:** Some knowledge of Spanish without completion of VCE Spanish or an approved equivalent, and approval of the subject coordinator.

**Corequisites:** 922-003 LaTrobe-Spanish Intermediate 1A (p.3).

**Contact:** A 1-hour practical class and a 1-hour laboratory class per week (*Semester 1*).

**Description:** This subject concentrates on training in listening and speaking skills in Spanish. Listening activities constitute the core of the subject, and are comprised of materials from a diverse range of varieties and registers of Spanish. Students will work individually and in small groups on a range of activities and tasks involving comprehension and production of original materials. Much of this work will be done via the computer-aided language laboratory and the audio language laboratory.

**Assessment:** Two 15-minute listening comprehension tests, a 10-minute oral production test, and class participation.

**Credit points:** 12.5 **HECS-band:** 1

**Coordinator:** Ms Isabel Moutinho

**Prerequisites:** 922-003 LaTrobe-Spanish Intermediate 1A (p.3) and 922-211 LaTrobe-Spanish Intermediate 1B (p.3) or approval of the subject coordinator.

**Corequisites:** 922-212 LaTrobe-Spanish Intermediate 1D (p.3).

**Contact:** Three hours of practical language classes per week (*Semester 2*).

**Description:** This subject continues to emphasise performance in the skills of speaking, listening, reading and writing, but on a more advanced level than Spanish Intermediate 1A. It contains elements related to practical language acquisition and the study of Spanish and Latin American culture through film and text.

**Assessment:** Written work totalling 1500 words, oral/aural tests totalling 20 minutes and a 1.5-hour written test.

### 922-212 LaTrobe-Spanish Intermediate 1D

**Note:** Special enrolment arrangements apply. Students must contact the Faculty of Art office for application forms and further details. This subject was previously 1C4: Intermediate Spanish 1.

**Availability:** 1st year

**Credit points:** 6.25 **HECS-band:** 1

**Coordinator:** Ms Isabel Moutinho

**Prerequisites:** 922-003 LaTrobe-Spanish Intermediate 1A (p.3) and 922-211 LaTrobe-Spanish Intermediate 1B (p.3) or approval of the subject coordinator.

**Corequisites:** 922-004 LaTrobe-Spanish Intermediate 1C (p.3).

**Contact:** A 1-hour practical class and a 1-hour laboratory class per week (*Semester 2*).

**Description:** This subject concentrates on training in listening and speaking skills in Spanish. Listening activities constitute the core of the subject, and are comprised of materials from a diverse range of varieties and registers of Spanish. Students will work individually and in small groups on a range of activities and tasks involving comprehension and production of original materials. Much of this work will be done via the computer-aided language laboratory and the audio language laboratory.

**Assessment:** Two 15-minute listening comprehension tests, a 10-minute oral production test, and class participation.

**Corequisites:** 922-209 LaTrobe-Spanish Advanced 1B (p.3).

**Contact:** A 1-hour practical class, a 1-hour grammar class, and a 1-hour seminar per week (*Semester 1*).

**Description:** This subject combines practical Spanish language and grammar, and an introduction to modern Spanish and Latin American culture. Written texts, radio and TV material, films and literary texts will be used to sharpen and develop performance in speaking, listening, reading and writing, and to broaden the student's knowledge of Hispanic culture.

**Assessment:** A written exercise of 500 words, a 2-hour test, practical exercises (written, oral and aural) totalling 2000 words, and class participation.

### 922-209 LaTrobe-Spanish Advanced 1B

**Note:** Special enrolment arrangements apply. Students must contact the Faculty of Arts office for application forms and further details. This subject was previously 1A2: Advanced Spanish 1.

**Availability:** 1st year

**Credit points:** 6.25 **HECS-band:** 1

**Coordinator:** Dr Lilit Thwaites

**Prerequisites:** VCE (HSC) Spanish or an approved equivalent.

**Corequisites:** 922-005 LaTrobe-Spanish Advanced 1A (*p.3*).

**Contact:** A 1-hour practical class and a 1-hour laboratory class per week (*Semester 1*).

**Description:** This subject concentrates on training in listening and speaking skills in Spanish. Listening activities constitute the core of the subject, and are comprised of materials from a diverse range of varieties and registers of Spanish. Students will work individually and in small groups on a range of activities and tasks involving comprehension and production of original materials. Much of this work will be done via the computer-aided language laboratory and the audio language laboratory.

**Corequisites:** 922-210 LaTrobe-Spanish Advanced 1D (*p.4*).

**Contact:** A 1-hour practical class, a 1-hour grammar class, and a 1-hour seminar per week (*Semester 2*).

**Description:** This is a continuation of the program of language skills acquired in Spanish Advanced 1A. Aspects of Hispanic culture continue to be studied through written and audio-visual material.

**Assessment:** A written exercise of 500 words, a 2-hour test, practical exercises (written, oral and aural) totalling 2000 words, and class participation.

### 922-210 LaTrobe-Spanish Advanced 1D

**Note:** Special enrolment arrangements apply. Students must contact the Faculty of Arts office for application forms and further details. This subject was previously 1A4: Advanced Spanish 1.

**Availability:** 1st year

**Credit points:** 6.25

**HECS-band:** 1

**Coordinator:** Dr Lilit Thwaites

**Prerequisites:** 922-005 LaTrobe-Spanish Advanced 1A (*p.3*) and 922-209 LaTrobe-Spanish Advanced 1B (*p.3*) or approval of the subject coordinator.

**Corequisites:** 922-006 LaTrobe-Spanish Advanced 1C (*p.4*).

**Contact:** A 1-hour practical class and a 1-hour laboratory class per week (*Semester 2*).

**Description:** This subject concentrates on further developing listening and speaking skills in Spanish. Listening activities constitute the core of the subject, and are comprised of materials from a diverse range of varieties and registers of Spanish. Students will work individually and in small groups on a range of activities and tasks involving comprehension and production of original materials. Much of this work will be done via the computer-aided language laboratory and the audio language laboratory.

**Assessment:** Two 15-minute listening comprehension tests, a 10-minute oral production test, and class participation.

## Second year subjects

### 922-213 LaTrobe-Spanish Beginners 2A

**Note:** Special enrolment arrangements apply. Students must contact the Faculty of Arts office for application forms and further details. This subject was previously 2B1: Beginners Spanish 2.

**Availability:** 2nd year

**Credit points:** 18.75

**HECS-band:** 1

**Coordinator:** Ms Isabel Moutinho

**Prerequisites:** 922-002 LaTrobe-Spanish Beginners 1C (*p.2*) and 922-208 LaTrobe-Spanish Beginners 1D (*p.3*) or approval of the subject coordinator.

**Contact:** A 1-hour seminar and three hours of practical classes (*Semester 1*).

**Description:** This subject is in many ways a continuation of Spanish 1B3 and 1B4. It emphasises the skills of speaking and listening, while also attending to the development of reading and writing skills. The student will be involved in a wide range of language acquisition activities and will be exposed to the Spanish language and Hispanic culture through the written language, radio, TV and film. Various aspects of Catalan civilisation will be introduced and the problematic coexistence of Catalan alongside Spanish, especially in relation to Barcelona, will be explored.

Novels in English translation by Allende (Chile), García Márquez (Colombia) and Vargas Llosa (Peru) will be studied in the context of Latin American society and in relation to some of the vital literary issues that have come to the fore since the 'boom', including the nexus between the Latin American and European novel, politics and gender, and the role of the literary intellectual in the Spanish-speaking world. Attention will also be given to the problems posed by the subject itself: those of literature in translation.

**Description:** Students undertake an intensive four-week language immersion program either at the Universidad de Guadalajara (Mexico), Universidad de la Habana (Cuba), Universidad de Belgrano (Buenos Aires, Argentina) or the Pontificia Universidad Católica de Chile (Santiago de Chile), either during the period June-July or the period January-February. Students will be assigned to one of three levels, beginners, intermediate or advanced, by means of a placement test. Students are responsible for travel, accommodation and tuition expenses.

#### 922-017 LaTrobe-Spanish Women Writers

**Note:** Special enrolment arrangements apply. Students must contact the Faculty of Arts office for application forms and further details. This subject was previously 3/4CW: Spanish Women Writers.

**Availability:** 3rd and 4th year

**Credit points:** 12.5

**HECS-band:** 1

**Prerequisites:** Approval of the subject coordinator.

**Semester:** Not Offered

**Description:** Women writers have come to the fore in Spain in the 20th century, particularly since the Civil War period. This subject is a general introduction to the works of some of these writers and an examination of their place in Spanish literature and society. This will be followed by a more detailed study of some specific works. Attention will be paid to the major literary trends and developments in 20th century Spain, and the important role of women writers within those trends and developments. The status of women in Spanish society (pre- and post-Civil War) and the reflection of that status (and of Spanish society in general) in Spanish women's writing will be examined, together with the impact of Spanish feminism and feminist literary theory on Spanish women's writing.

#### 922-018 LaTrobe-Latin American Literature

**Semester:** Semester 1

**Description:** In this subject students are concerned with the study and analysis of works by writers from the three geographic and political divisions of Latin America: North, Central and South. Special attention is paid to writings by Luisa Valenzuela (Argentina), Carlos Fuentes (Mexico) and Manlio Argueta (El Salvador), which are analysed in relation to their respective theories of literature and the role of literary intellectuals in their respective countries.

#### 922-019 LaTrobe-Spanish Dialectology

**Description:** This subject studies the analysis and description of rural and urban varieties of modern peninsular and Latin American Spanish and addresses the question of varieties of Spanish in the migrant community in Australia. Discussion centres on a range of audio and video recorded materials and the student will conduct a brief research project involving data collection in the community.

#### 922-124 LaTrobe-Latin American Literature

**Prerequisites:** Approval of the subject coordinator

**Semester:** Not Offered

**Description:** This subject is designed to acquaint students with some of the major works of both the modern and contemporary periods in Latin American literature. A general introduction to contemporary Latin American literature will be followed by an analysis of works by Allende, García Márquez and Vargas Llosa. The texts will be analysed from various perspectives including socio-political, psychological, feminist and postmodern. To this end, Vargas Llosa's *The Power of Lies* will also be examined.
