

R6.146 - BRYAN SCHOLARSHIPS

Recitals-

- A. Frederick Bryan late of Highdene Guildford in the County of Surrey formerly of 49 Harley Street in the County of Middlesex Medical Practitioner who died on 12 July 1922 bequeathed the residue of his estate to the trustees for the time being of the University of Melbourne upon trust to use and apply the same as and for the endowment of a scholarship or scholarships in Natural Science tenable at the said University to be awarded and held in such manner as the said last mentioned trustees shall think fit and to be named (if the said trustees consider proper) the "Bryan Scholarship or Scholarships" in memory of his mother and of the benefits conferred upon him in early life.
- B. The University received the sum of \$14,028 in satisfaction of the bequest.
- C. From 2009 a new postgraduate coursework degree of master of Science will be offered, in which students may choose to undertake a research training program as part of the coursework syllabus. By undertaking a research training program in and completing the new postgraduate coursework degree of master of Science, or by completing a postgraduate diploma in Science or the honours year of the bachelor of Science degree, a student is eligible to apply for acceptance into a course for a research higher degree, namely the degree of master of Philosophy or the degree of doctor of Philosophy.

It is provided as follows-

- 1. The sum of \$14,028 and any accumulations and additions to the sum forms a fund called the "Bryan Scholarships" ("fund") and the fund must be paid into an investment pool and remain there until Council directs otherwise.
- 2. The scholarships are awarded by Council on the recommendation of the faculty of Science ('faculty') to candidates who have completed the course for the degree of bachelor of Science and who are undertaking or are about to undertake studies in a branch of natural science either through the degree of bachelor of Science with honours, a postgraduate diploma in Science or a research training program in the degree of master of Science.
- 3. Two scholarships are available for award each year, one only of which is awarded to a student undertaking studies in a biological sciences discipline.
- 4. The value of each scholarship is one half of the net annual income of the fund for the preceding year.
- 5. The ordinary tenure of the scholarship is one year but if at any time Council, on the recommendation of the faculty, is of the opinion that a scholar is not pursuing his or her work satisfactorily, it may terminate the scholarship.
