

R6.78 - C.D. HUME VIOLIN SCHOLARSHIP**Recitals-**

- A. Mr Charles Darley Hume of 18 Fairmount Road, Hawthorn, in 1949 presented to the University the sum of £1,000 to form the endowment of a scholarship in the study of the violin to be known as the "C.D. Hume Violin Scholarship".
- B. The donor's intention in founding the scholarship was to help students in need of financial assistance.
- C. The sum of £1,000 increased to \$3,305 at 31 December 1994.

It is provided as follows-

- 1. The sum of \$3,305 and any accumulations or additions to the sum forms a fund called the "C.D. Hume Violin Scholarship Fund" ("the fund") must be paid into an investment pool and must remain there until the Council directs otherwise.
- 2. The amount of the scholarship is the net annual income of the fund.
- 3. The scholarship is awarded to a person qualified to enter the course for the degree of bachelor of Music or bachelor of Music Education specialising in violin performance and who produces to the faculty of Music ("the faculty") evidence of a need for financial assistance to undertake the course or to a student specialising in violin performance who has completed one or more Years of such a course and who produces to the faculty evidence of a sudden or unforeseen inability to proceed with the course without financial assistance.
- 4. The scholarship is awarded by the Council on the recommendation of the faculty and in the case of a person qualified to enter a course the award is conditional upon that person's enrolment in that course.
- 5. The scholarship is open for award annually and is tenable for one year but may, subject to the continuance of the need or inability referred to in section 3, be renewed on the recommendation of the faculty for a further period of one year if in the opinion of the faculty the scholar's diligence and progress are satisfactory.
