

R6.81 - MURIEL CHEEK MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

Recitals-

- A. A sum of money was subscribed in 1951 to provide a memorial to Muriel Cheek who for seven years was a chief study teacher of singing at the University Conservatorium of Music and to commemorate her interest in the development of music and particularly in young singers.
- B. The University received from a committee of subscribers the sum of £1,000 with a request that the amount be invested and that the income derived therefrom be applied to found in the Conservatorium a scholarship to be known as the "Muriel Cheek Memorial Scholarship" to be open only to students of singing.
- C. The purposes for which the Conservatorium was established are now carried out by the faculty of Music and the name "University Conservatorium of Music" has been discontinued.
- D. The capital of the scholarship fund at 31 December 1994 was \$2,509.

It is provided as follows -

- 1. The sum of \$2,509 and any accumulations or additions to the sum forms a fund called the "Muriel Cheek Memorial Scholarship Fund" ("the fund") and the fund must be paid into an investment pool and remain there until the Council directs otherwise.
- 2. The amount of the scholarship is the net annual income of the fund.
- 3. The scholarship is awarded by the Council on the recommendation of the faculty of Music ("the faculty") to a student who is pursuing the course for the degree of bachelor of Music or bachelor of Music Education and is specialising in vocal performance.
- 4. The scholarship is awarded in the first instance for one year but the Council may, on the recommendation of the faculty, extend the scholarship for a further period not exceeding one year.
- 5. During the period of tenure the scholar must diligently pursue studies in such a course of subjects as is prescribed by the dean of the faculty.
