

## **R6.163 - JAMES HERBERT MIRAMS MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIPS**

### **Recitals-**

- A. Alice Ida Mirams late of "Merton", South Road Brighton bequeathed one-half of her residuary estate to the University" for the endowment of a scholarship or scholarships each of which shall be known as the "James Herbert Mirams Memorial Scholarship" to be awarded to engineering students whether postgraduate or otherwise at the University of Melbourne on such terms and conditions as the Council of the said University acting on the recommendation of the Faculty of Engineering shall from time to time prescribe".
- B. In satisfaction of the bequest the University received \$37,160, which sum increased to \$215,774 at 31 December 1994.

It is provided as follows

- 1. The sum of \$215,774 and any accumulations and additions to the sum forms a fund called the "James Herbert Mirams Memorial Scholarship" ("the fund") and the fund must be paid into an investment pool and remain there until the Council directs otherwise.
- 2. Each scholarship is open for award annually amongst
  - (a) graduate students undertaking postgraduate studies in Engineering at the University, and
  - (b) such undergraduate students who are enrolled for the courses for the degree of bachelor of Engineering as the faculty may from time to time invite to make application for the scholarship
- 3. (1) Each scholarship is tenable for one year and is of a value determined from time to time by the Council on the advice of the faculty of Engineering provided that the value of all scholarships awarded in one year does not exceed the net annual income of the fund for that year.  
  
(2) If in any year no scholarship is awarded or any income remains unexpended after the award of the scholarship or scholarships for that year the unspent income for that year must be added to the fund.
- 4. A graduate scholar must either
  - (a) undertake advanced studies or conduct research in the faculty of Engineering, ("the faculty") or
  - (b) at the discretion of the faculty travel in Australia or overseas on an approved course of study for the purpose of gaining further knowledge of or experience in Engineering;

and may, on the recommendation of the faculty, be awarded one further scholarship in the year following the first award.

5. (1) The amount of a scholarship is payable in four equal instalments normally at the end of each quarter but is subject in the case of
  - (a) a graduate scholar engaged in advanced studies or research at the University, to the production of a certificate by the person under whose supervision the advanced studies or research is being conducted stating that the scholar is pursuing such advanced studies or research;
  - (b) an undergraduate scholar, to the production of a certificate by the head of the department responsible for the course of studies undertaken by the scholar, stating that the scholar has fulfilled the requirements of the course during the preceding quarter, and
  - (c) a travelling scholar, to the receipt from the scholar of periodical reports satisfactory to the faculty.
- (2) The final instalment must not be paid until the scholar in each case has furnished a satisfactory report of the work carried out during the tenure of the scholarship.
