

**UTR6.76 - JANE ARIADNE McLaurin Thomson and Barclay Thomson
Scholarship**

Recitals-

- A. Jane Ariadne Thomson, late of Melbourne, who died on 16 October, 1932, bequeathed a share of her residuary estate to the University, and expressed a wish that the income of the bequest should be applied "to provide a scholarship for medical research work, particularly on the subject of 'Arthritis' such scholarship to be known as the 'Jane Ariadne McLaurin Thomson and Barclay Thomson Scholarship' " in memory of herself and her husband.
- B. The University received the sum of £4,270 18s. 2d. in satisfaction of the bequest, which sum increased to \$17,135 at 31 December 1994.

It is provided as follows-

- 1. The sum of \$17,135 and any accumulations and additions to the sum forms a fund called the "Thomson Medical Scholarship Fund" ("the fund") and the fund must be paid into an investment pool and remain there until the Council directs otherwise.
- 2. The income of the fund is used to establish and maintain a scholarship to be called the "Jane Ariadne McLaurin Thomson and Barclay Thomson scholarship".
- 3. The scholarship is awarded to a person who satisfies the medical research committee of his or her competence to undertake medical research, preference being given to a person who proposes to conduct research pertaining to Arthritis.
- 4. The emoluments of the scholarship are the net annual income of the fund.
- 5. The scholarship is awarded in the first instance for one year, but a scholar's tenure may be renewed for successive periods of one year.
