

UTR6.215 – THE WILLIAM ALLAN STEWART BEQUEST

Recitals-

- A. Dr William Allan Stewart, medical practitioner, of 'Carrakoorte', Monegeeta, Victoria, who died on 29 April 1958, bequeathed the whole of his residuary estate, subject to life interests, to the University. The bequest states-

'It is my wish that the said University shall use the same to establish scholarships in any one or more of the following namely Medicine, Veterinary Science and Agricultural Science in such manner as the Council or other governing body of the said University shall deem appropriate'.

- B. Following the death of the last life tenant on 4 June 1999 the University received the sum of \$1,164,153.43.
- C. Council decided that the income of the fund be applied to providing a scholarship and bursaries for students enrolled in the Institute of Land and Food Resources now the faculty of Land and Food Resources.

It is provided as follows-

1. The sum of \$1,164,153.43 and any accumulations and additions to the sum forms a fund called 'The William Allan Stewart Bequest' ('the fund') and the fund must be paid into an investment pool and remain there until Council directs otherwise.
2. The net annual income of the fund is to be applied by Council, on the recommendation of the dean of the Institute of Land and Food Resources ('the dean') to providing the William Allan Stewart Scholarship and William Allan Stewart Bursaries to students in agricultural science in the faculty of Land and Food Resources ('the faculty').
3. The William Allan Stewart Scholarship ('the scholarship') is awarded annually by Council on the recommendation of the dean to a student enrolling in the first year of a bachelor degree in Resource Management, Food Science, Agriculture, Animal Science and Management or any other degree course in agricultural science in the faculty ('the degree') who is not a recipient of the bursary described in section 7.
4. The scholarship is open to candidates on such conditions as Council on the recommendation of the dean may determine.
5. The duration of the scholarship will be the normal number of years of the course for the degree or the degree with honours.
6. The scholarship will be to the value of the fees payable to the University for each year of the course.
7. The William Allan Stewart Bursaries ('the bursaries'), which must not exceed six in any year and are tenable for one year, are awarded to students enrolling in the first year of the course for a bachelor degree in Resource Management, Agriculture, Food Science, Animal Science and Management or any other degree course in agricultural science in the faculty or for the advanced diploma in Agriculture or any other advanced diploma in agricultural

science in the faculty who are not recipients of the scholarship.

8. The bursaries are awarded on such conditions as Council on the recommendation of the dean may determine.
