

UTR7.222 – THE ALEXANDER NORMAN HENDERSON BEQUEST

Recitals–

- A. Alexander Norman Henderson, architect, of 29 Coolullah Avenue, South Yarra in the State of Victoria, who died on 28 May 1982 bequeathed half of his residual estate to the University subject to a life interest, which expired on 1 April 2001.
- B. The bequest was ‘for the purpose of advancing the study of architecture at the University to be expended on the recommendation of the Faculty of Architecture.’
- C. The ‘Faculty of Architecture’ is now the faculty of Architecture, Building and Planning.
- D. The University received the sum of \$94,672 in satisfaction of the bequest.

It is provided as follows-

- 1. The sum of \$94,672 and any accumulations and additions to the sum forms a fund called ‘The Alexander Norman Henderson Bequest Fund’ (‘the fund’) and the fund must be paid into an investment pool and remain there until Council directs otherwise.
- 2. The income of the fund must be applied by Council on the recommendation of the dean of the faculty of Architecture, Building and Planning (‘the dean’) to the advancement of the study of architecture.
- 3. Council on the recommendation of the dean may at any time direct that the whole or any part of the capital be used for the purpose stated in section 2.
