

## **UTR6.312 - THE DENISE O'HARA SCHOLARSHIP**

### Recitals-

- A. By her Will dated 28 January 2010, the late Denise Anne O'Hara MBBS PhD, ('donor') bequeathed \$100,000 to the University ('bequest') as follows -
- '...I express my wish that this gift be used for the purposes of the School of Medicine, Faculty of Medicine, Dentistry and Health Sciences ...'.
- B. The donor, who died on 2 February 2010, was a fellow of the Australasian Faculty of Public Health Medicine. In 2008 she was awarded her PhD for her thesis describing the role of Divisions of General Practice and the way in which they link general practices with the wider health system. The donor commenced her career in the Health Commission of Victoria in 1987 as part of the Drugs of Dependence Unit. She was well known through her work on primary health, public health and inter-governmental work.
- C. Having regard to the terms of the Will, the University decided to apply the bequest to establish a perpetual trust for scholarships, for students enrolled in the school of Medicine within the faculty of Medicine, Dentistry and Health Sciences, who are in their later years of study, and show particular aptitude and/or require financial assistance, in memory of Denise O'Hara ('faculty trusts').
- D. The bequest therefore became the capital subject to the faculty trusts ('capital sum').
- E. This University trust record is the means by which the University records-
- (1) the faculty trusts upon which the University as trustee holds trust property, including the capital sum; and
  - (2) the administrative arrangements for the implementation of those trusts, as determined by the University from time to time.

It is provided as follows-

### **Name of the fund**

1. The capital sum, all income arising from the capital sum, and any accumulations and additions thereto together form a fund called 'The Denise O'Hara Scholarship' ('fund').

### **Investment of the fund**

2. The fund is to be paid into one or more investment common funds and remain there until Council directs otherwise.

### **Trust terms**

3. As trustee of the fund, the University is required-
  - (1) to establish a perpetual trust;
  - (2) to award one or more scholarships, open for award annually, from the income of the fund ('scholarship'); and

- (3) to award each scholarship in memory of Denise O'Hara to a student enrolled in the school of Medicine within the faculty of Medicine, Dentistry and Health Sciences ('faculty'), who are in their later years of study, and show particular aptitude and/or require financial assistance.

#### **Administrative arrangements**

4. Until its further determination, and in order to implement the trust terms, the University has determined-
  - (1) to call each scholarship 'The Denise O'Hara Scholarship';
  - (2) that the dean of the faculty ('dean') is to award each scholarship upon the recommendation of the head of the school of Medicine or nominee, who is to determine-
    - (a) the recipient of each scholarship,
    - (b) the value of each scholarship, and
    - (c) the number of scholarships to be awarded each year;
  - (3) that if in any year there is any unspent income, the unspent income may be added to the capital of the fund or accumulated as income for the award in a subsequent year of one or more scholarships;
  - (4) the dean, upon the recommendation of the head of the school of Medicine (or, if applicable, the nominee), is to decide each year for the purposes of section 4(3) whether any unspent income is to be added to the capital of the fund or is to be accumulated as income.
5. The dean is authorised to award each scholarship on behalf of the University.
