Vax4Youth: Consent and COVID-19 Vaccination in Young People aged 12-17 years: Clinical, Legal, and Ethical Perspectives in Primary Health Care



A team of researchers from the Murdoch Children's Research Institute, the Royal Children's Hospital, the University of Melbourne, and the Australian Catholic University are conducting a study into young people's access to COVID-19 vaccination, particularly when without parental consent.
