

## UTR6.37 - R.G. WILSON SCHOLARSHIPS

Recitals-

- A. Mrs. Annie Wilson widow of the late R.G. Wilson merchant of Melbourne by her will bequeathed to the University the sum of £2,000 for the purpose of founding a scholarship or scholarships in such subject or subjects as the Council of the University may think best to be called the 'R.G. Wilson Scholarship or Scholarships'.
- B. The University received (including interest) the sum of £2,160 4s.8d. ('capital sum') in satisfaction of the bequest..

It is provided as follows-

- 1. The capital sum and any accumulations and additions to the capital sum form a fund called the 'R.G. Wilson Scholarships' ('fund') and the fund must be paid into one or more investment common funds and remain there until the Council directs otherwise.
- 2. These are the following R.G. Wilson Scholarships ('scholarships')-
  - (a) one scholarship awarded annually to the best student enrolled in a third-year course in History in the academic unit responsible for the discipline of History; and
  - (b) three scholarships awarded annually to the best honours students enrolled in the faculty of Arts ('faculty').
- 3. The scholarships are equal in value, and funded from the net annual income of the fund.
- 4. Each scholarship is awarded by the dean of the faculty ('dean'), and in the case of the annual scholarship to the best student enrolled in a third-year course in History, by the dean upon the recommendation of the head of that academic unit.
