

**UTR6.84      SAMUEL LEON BURSARY IN MEDICINE**

**Recitals-**

- A. Ethel Selina Leon, late of 178A Wattletree Road, Malvern, who died on 14 November 1950, bequeathed to the University the sum of £2,000 subject to the following condition-

'To be held by it in perpetuity as a memorial to my late father, Samuel Leon, to provide from the income thereof for a bursary to be given to a student of the Medical school at the University who is entering upon the second year of a medical course, and whose circumstances are such that he or she requires some financial assistance to continue such course such bursary to be continued throughout the remainder of such course but subject to the discretion of the Professorial Board at such University.'

It is provided as follows-

1. The sum of £2,000 ('capital sum'), all income arising from the capital sum, and any additions and accumulations thereto together form a fund called the 'Samuel Leon Bursary' ('fund'), which must be paid into one or more investment common funds and remain there until the Council directs otherwise.
2. The bursary is funded from the net income of the fund.
3. The bursary is awarded by the dean of the faculty of Medicine Dentistry and Health Sciences ('dean') following consultation with the administrative unit responsible for student financial aid matters.
4. Applicants must produce evidence that-
  - (a) they are enrolled in the second year of the course for the degree of doctor of Medicine ('course'); and
  - (b) their circumstances are such that they require financial assistance to continue the course.
5. The normal tenure of the bursary is the period required to complete the course.
6. The dean is authorised to award the bursary on behalf of the University.
