

UTR6.79 - ALICE BARBER MEMORIAL FUND

Recitals-

- A. The Alice Barber Memorial Fund Committee presented to the University the sum of £475 2s. 2d. for the purpose of perpetuating the memory of Alice Barber, bachelor of Medicine and bachelor of Surgery of this University, a practitioner in the field of psychotherapy and a teacher in the University, and has directed that the fund be used to assist, by grants or loans, graduates who are qualified for training in psychotherapy and who undertake to practise for at least five years in Australia and for such other purposes as may be deemed advisable to advance the training in psychotherapy.
- B. The sum of £475 2s. 2d. was \$882 at 31 December 1994.

It is provided as follows-

1. The sum of \$882 and any accumulations and additions to the fund must, subject to section 2, form the endowment of a fund called the "Alice Barber Memorial Fund" ("the fund") and the fund must be paid into an investment pool and remain there until the Council directs otherwise:

Provided that the Council must out of the moneys received reimburse to the committee any expenses reasonably incurred from time to time in the raising of the fund.

2. The net annual income of the fund must be used-
- (a) to assist graduates, whether by way of grants, scholarships, loans or otherwise and whether for study in Australia or elsewhere, who are qualified to train in Psychotherapy and who undertake to practise for at least five years in Australia; and
- (b) to arrange lectures in Psychotherapy whether by overseas lecturers or otherwise-

Provided that the Council may direct that in any particular year part of the capital may be also used for these purposes.

3. (1) The fund is administered by the Council on the recommendation of a committee appointed from time to time by the Council on the recommendation of the dean of the faculty of Medicine, Dentistry and Health sciences.
- (2) Where practicable a member of the family of the late Dr Alice Barber is to be invited to attend any meeting of the committee.
4. The Council may terminate any scholarship or grant if the recipient does not carry out his or her duties satisfactorily in the opinion of the committee.
