

UTR6.221 - THE PETER BLAZEY FELLOWSHIP

Recitals-

- A. Mr Clive Blazezy of 'Heronswood', Dromana, Victoria and Mr Tim Herbert of Potts Point, New South Wales donated to the University a total of \$200,000 by 4 July 2002.
- B. The fund is to be used to establish a fellowship in memory of Peter Blazezy, of Potts Point in New South Wales, writer and journalist, who died on 7 February 1997. The donors who are the brother and partner respectively of the deceased prescribed the terms of the fellowship. Peter Blazezy graduated with a bachelor of Arts (*Melb*). in Political Science in 1964.
- C. Other donors contributed a further sum of \$3,250 to the fund.
- D. A total sum of \$203,250 was received.

It is provided as follows-

- 1. The sum of \$203,250 and any accumulations and additions to the sum forms a fund called 'The Peter Blazezy Fellowship Fund' ('fund') and the fund must be paid into one or more common investment pools and remain there until Council directs otherwise.
- 2. The fellowship is to be awarded annually by Council on the recommendation of a committee ('committee') comprising:
 - (i) the dean of the faculty of Arts ('the dean') or his or her nominee;
 - (ii) the director of the Australian Centre ('the director') or his or her nominee;
 - (iii) one of the donors or a nominee of the donors during their lifetime; and
 - (iv) the editor of a contemporary literary journal nominated by the director.
- 3. The fellowship is open for award nationally.
- 4. The total value of the fellowship awarded in any year must not exceed the net annual income of the fund.
- 5. The availability of the award must be advertised by the committee in such a manner as it in its absolute discretion considers appropriate, and the cost of such advertising and other promotional costs are to be met out of the fund.
- 6. The recipient during the term of the fellowship-
 - (i) must apply himself or herself to writing a biography or autobiography, as agreed in consultation with the director; and
 - (ii) will have such access to facilities of the Australian Centre within the faculty of Arts as may be approved by the director.
- 7. If at any time Council believed that it is impossible or impractical to continue to award the fellowship, then Council may apply the income of the fund and, where necessary, the capital for

such other purpose as is, in its opinion, most closely in accordance with the donors' intentions to commemorate Peter Blazey.

8. As provided in section 43 of the Act, Council has delegated to the dean of the faculty of Arts its powers and duties set out in this record, other than for the purposes of section 7 dealing with alternative applications of the income and capital in the event that the fellowship can no longer be awarded. The dean has authorised the director to award the fellowship where the dean is unavailable to do so.
