

UTR7.137 - JOAN ALICE DUNCAN BEQUEST

Recitals-

- A. Joan Alice Duncan, late of East Melbourne, in the State of Victoria, who died on 22 February 1984, bequeathed to the University the whole of her residuary estate "for use in the faculty of Medicine for research purposes".
- B. The University received cash and investments amounting in value to \$244,905 in satisfaction of the bequest, which sum increased to \$350,288 at 31 December 1994.
- C. The faculty of Medicine is now known as the faculty of Medicine, Dentistry and Health Sciences.

It is provided as follows

- 1. The cash and investments totalling \$350,288 and any accumulations and additions to them form a fund called the "Joan Alice Duncan Bequest" ("the fund") and the fund must be paid into an investment pool and remain there until the Council directs otherwise.
- 2. (1) The income of the fund is applied to research in the faculty of Medicine, Dentistry and Health Sciences ("the faculty") on the recommendation of the Medical Research Committee ("the committee").
(2) The Council may on the recommendation of the committee and the faculty direct that the capital of the fund be resorted to for the purpose set out in (1).
