

UTR7.193 - LOUISA JEAN de BRETTEVILLE BEQUEST

Recitals-

- A. Mrs. Louisa Jean de Bretteville, late of 2000 Washington Street, San Francisco, California, in the United States of America, who died on 20 April 1994, bequeathed to the University seven one-hundredths of her residuary estate to be applied by the Department of Ophthalmology 'for the purposes of research into the curing and treatment of diseases of the eye.'
- B. Mrs. de Bretteville was born in Melbourne in September 1903 to Duncan and Alice Gilchrist and was educated at Clyde at Woodend. In 1926 she married Mr Thorold Fink, a director of the Herald and Weekly Times Group, who was killed in a jeep accident whilst on active service in 1942. She married Mr. Alec de Bretteville in San Francisco in 1947.
- C. The University received \$440,631 in satisfaction of the bequest.

It is provided as follows-

- 1. The sum of \$440,631 and any accumulations or additions to the sum forms a fund called the 'Louisa Jean de Bretteville Bequest' ('the fund') which must be paid into an investment pool and remain there until the Council directs otherwise.
- 2. The net annual income of the fund is to be applied to research into the curing and treatment of diseases of the eye in the department of Ophthalmology.
- 3. The net annual income is to be expended by Council on the recommendation of the dean of the faculty of Medicine, Dentistry and Health Sciences who before making any such recommendation must consult the head of the department of Ophthalmology.
- 4. The Council may direct that the capital of the fund be resorted to for the purpose stated in section 2.
